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INTRODUCTION

There has been an extensive review of ECB Coach Education and a new ECB Coach Education Programme will be available from September 2013. The general structure of Coach Qualification and Development will remain similar to recent years, with certificated courses to suit all ages and abilities. An integral course programme for teachers is also planned for Autumn 2013 – details to be announced in the next few months. ECB Coaching Qualifications will still be governed by UKCC Certification.

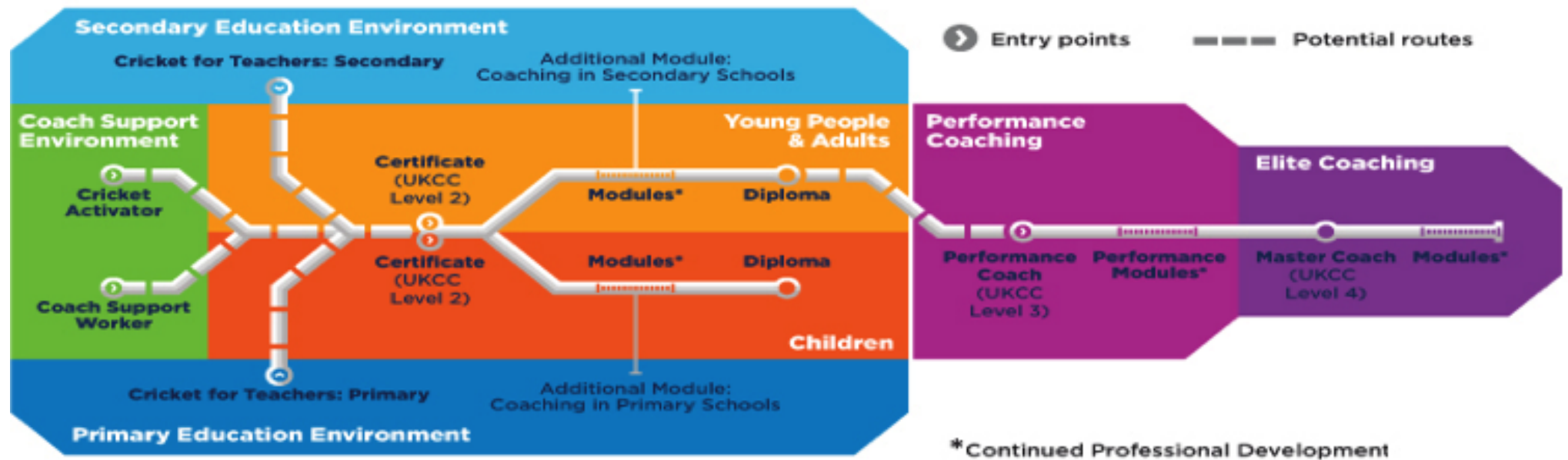
In addition to these New ECB Course Opportunities outlined in the following pages, Cricket Wales is pleased to announce an increase in its own available Wales Coach Workshops for 2013/2014. As well as continuing to offer the Technically and Practically based 4 Workshops introduced in some Regions last Winter – we have devised a further 3 Workshops to add to our extensive Programme for this Winter Season – “Batting: Advanced Skills and Knowledge”, “Bowling: Advanced Skills and Knowledge” & “Captaincy and Tactical Awareness”. These Workshops, exclusively available in Wales, are all 3 Hour Courses and will provide invaluable Technical, Tactical & Cricket Awareness information to all Qualified Coaches,

The shift in ECB Course Direction and Content is driven by the desire to make coaching more “Player-Centred”. One of the biggest changes is to offer two “entry-points” for coaches wishing to become a fully qualified coach – a coach can either attend the Certificate in Coaching Children Course or the Certificate in Coaching Young People and Adults Course – both courses carry the same level of Certification – but crucially allow a coach to be trained in disciplines more suited to working with players of a specific age range – therefore making a coach more aware of a players specific needs.

From September 2013, full Coach Qualification (allowing a qualified coach to work alone) will begin at “Certificate” level and will be underpinned by two shorter courses aimed broadly at training people to “support” fully qualified coaches – “Coach Support Worker” and “Cricket Activator”.

ECB COACH SUPPORT WORKER

The Coach Support Worker Course looks to focus on the potential role of a “Coach’s Assistant” and will include:

Course Content

- Simple Laws of the game
- Safety and risk assessment
- Organising warm-ups and cool-downs
- Roles and responsibilities
- Working relationships with coaches
- Game and activity management
- Setting up activities and practices

It is likely there will be a basic Assessment of candidates carried out during the 6 Hour Workshop

Individuals wishing to assist under the direct supervision of ECB qualified coaches in the delivery of high quality practical cricket coaching sessions within a club environment.

1ST4SPORT LEVEL 2 CERTIFICATE IN COACHING CHILDREN'S CRICKET (QCF)

This new course looks to offer specialist instruction and support for candidates who primarily wish to become fully qualified coaches and work with children from 6 to 13 years of age. The Course Content is both Classroom and Sports Hall based and is very much centred around active skills and games.

The new HOWZAT! "on-line" Coach Resource will be a part of the Candidate Resource Pack and the course involves working closely at times with this excellent Resource - so access to a computer is essential! The Course itself looks to cover the following areas of work:

WALES COACH WORKSHOPS 2013/2014

The Cricket Wales Workshops were devised in early 2012 in order to provide all Qualified Coaches in Wales with the knowledge and skills they need to meet the development needs of our young players in Wales. It is fair to say that whilst all Qualified Coaches pick-up a huge amount of knowledge from their initial Qualification Course(s) – it is extremely difficult to retain that knowledge or even grasp its full meaning on that first course!

The 7 Cricket Wales Workshops do provide a full range of Technical, Tactical & Cricket Awareness information that the great majority of coaches will need to be aware of when working with players of different skill levels and ages.

The Workshops are largely “active” sessions and seek to give coaches the opportunity to not only listen to some of the most experienced and qualified cricketers, coaches and tutors in the UK, but to also discuss their own coaching experiences and views – as well as practice some of the techniques/practices learned!

All workshops are 3 hours in length.

WALES COACH WORKSHOP - CONTENT

BATTING – KEY BASIC PRINCIPLES

TUTOR: John Derrick

The Workshop aims to concentrate on the key basic technical skills of batting and looks at the basic application of these skills. The Workshop offers a chance for Coaches to personally practice the techniques discussed and also allows Coaches to discuss their own issues of concern and views alike. This Workshop forms a key part of all batting coaching knowledge and serves as a very valuable reminder of what the key technical issues are to both experienced and newly qualified coaches.

BOWLING - KEY BASIC PRINCIPLES

TUTORS: Steve Watkin & Barry Lloyd

The Workshop aims to concentrate on the key basic technical skills of bowling and looks at the basic application of these skills. The Workshop offers a chance for Coaches to personally practice the techniques discussed and also allows Coaches to discuss their own issues of concern and views alike. This Workshop forms a key part of all bowling coaching knowledge and serves as a very valuable reminder of what the key technical issues are to both experienced and newly qualified coaches.

WICKETKEEPING

TUTOR: Adrian Shaw

Wicketkeeping is often seen as the “forgotten art” in the Game today, so this Workshop is crucially important in offering help and advice in how to find and identify potentially good Wicketkeepers. The Workshop also focuses heavily on how a ‘Keeper prepares for a match and the key skills he/she needs to practice to gain confidence and become the most important fielder on the pitch. The inclusion of local, young ‘Keepers on the Workshop will allow coaches to observe and practice their Coaching Skills learned on this Workshop.

FIELDING

TUTOR: John Derrick

All Coaches should appreciate the importance of a good fielding performance – it can often mean that small difference between winning and losing! The Workshop looks at top cricketers performing in the middle via DVD footage and highlights their preparation and movement – before going into the Sports Hall environment to see many of the skills utilised in action and to see some of the many Practice Fielding Drills in action. Catching also forms a key part of this Workshop.

BATTING: ADVANCED SKILLS & KNOWLEDGE

TUTOR: John Derrick

This new Workshop ideally serves as a follow-on from the “BATTING – KEY BASIC PRINCIPLES” Workshop and moves on to study the more advanced Batting Techniques & Skills we might see at higher levels and utilised by our better batsmen, both young & old. The Workshop also focuses heavily on the non-physical side of batting – Mental preparation and application, building an innings, setting and planning for target totals, playing the percentages, etc. This information will prove invaluable in working with batsmen in Match Situations in particular.

BOWLING: ADVANCED SKILLS & KNOWLEDGE

TUTORS: Steve Watkin & Barry Lloyd

This new Workshop ideally serves as a follow-on from the “BOWLING – KEY BASIC PRINCIPLES” Workshop and moves on to study the more advanced Bowling Techniques & Skills we might see at higher levels and utilised by our better Seam & Spin Bowlers, both young & old - Variations of Pace Movement, Bowling Strategy and Setting the right Field. The Workshop also focuses heavily on the non-physical side of bowling – Mental preparation and application. This information will prove invaluable in working with bowlers in Match Situations in particular.

CAPTAINCY & TACTICAL AWARENESS

TUTOR: John Derrick

This new Workshop will help coaches working at all levels of the Game to develop the “awareness” side of the game of cricket in all our players – but will crucially allow them to identify those players who have the potential skills and personal qualities to become our Captains of the future. The Workshop will focus on typical qualities of good captains, concentrating on real situations from past & present and provide good evidence on what makes a great Leader. The Workshop will also concentrate heavily on the importance of the Tactical side of cricket and the importance of getting players to “think on their feet” and react positively and intelligently to Changing Match Situations.
