- Lead communications and feedback with players and parents throughout the year
- Work closely with the Head of Talent Pathway and National Age Group Coaches to ensure clarity on selection and coaching practices
- Work closely with the CWS Working Group to shape and drive best practice for the area
- Foster and maintain strong relationships with players, parents, clubs and the Area team
- Work closely with National Age Group Coaches to feed players into activities prior to selection for the summer
- Manage the regional pathway budget in accordance with the Head of Talent Pathway
- Assist the Head of Talent Pathway in Coach CPD & Parental Development
- Any further duties that the Head of Talent Pathway sees fit, providing that such duties are appropriate to the role
